Demonstrative Pronouns

A *demonstrative pronoun* points out a specific person, place, thing, or idea.

Demonstrative Pronouns this that these those

EXAMPLES What is **that**?

This is the uniform once worn by Satchel Paige.

These are the shoes he used to wear.

Are those really his autographs?

When these words are used to modify a noun or pronoun, they are called **demonstrative adjectives**.

PRONOUN **This** is a delicious papaya. [*This* refers to *papaya*.] ADJECTIVE **This** papaya is delicious. [*This* modifies *papaya*.]

PRONOUN That is the stamp my cousin sent from Sweden.

[That refers to stamp.]

ADJECTIVE **That** stamp was the first in my collection. [That

modifies stamp.]

Indefinite Pronouns

An *indefinite pronoun* refers to a person, a place, a thing, or an idea that may or may not be specifically named.
